NFL, NASCAR, AND FISHING



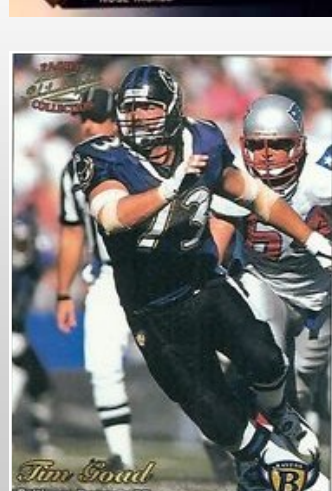
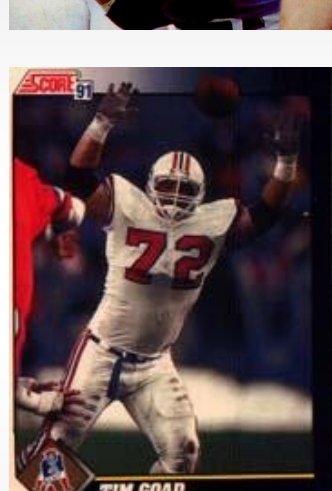
What does NFL, NASCAR, and fishing have in common? Native Patrick Countian Tim Goad.

Tim Goad was born in Patrick County in February 1966. He attended Patrick County High School and played offensive and defensive tackle for the high school's football team, the Patrick County Cougars. After high school, Tim attended the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill, where he played on the defensive line. In 1988, he was drafted by the New England Patriots where he made his first professional appearance on September 4th. The Patriots' took a 28-3 victory. After playing 7 seasons with the Patriots, Tim played a year for the Cleveland Browns, then finished his NFL career with the Baltimore Ravens. After retiring from the NFL, he received a call from one of his friends that worked for the legendary Wood Brothers Racing Team. Tim was offered a position as their jack man and began his debut in 1998. Since making the transition from NFL to NASCAR, Tim has also worked at Petty Enterprise., and currently serves as pit-crew coach and jack man for Kevin Harvick Inc.

In an article with Carolina Outdoors, when asks what he plans to do when he retires from NASCAR, Tim says, "I'm going to turn into a full-time bass pro."

Along with musical partner and long-time friend Scott Eutsler of OmBrew, Chris is a member of One Family Productions, which produces the annual [Front Porch Fest](#). Front Porch Fest is an annual music festival where local, regional and national musicians showcase their talent. What started out as a small gathering of family & friends on the front porch of One Family Productions President, Chris Prutting's home, Front Porch Fest has now become a popular four-day festival based around World and Americana Music.

Chris is currently working on his debut solo album, a full length work which will showcase songs that he has written and arranged. "It's been a long road to get to this, but this has been my ultimate goal musically for a long time", says Chris. |--|--------------------------|
| 4 cups sliced apples (4 medium apples) | 1/2 cup oats |
| 1 cup raisins | 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon |
| 1 cup brown sugar | 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg |
| 2/3 cup brown sugar | 1/2 cup butter, softened |
| 1/2 cup flour | |



Preheat oven to 375°. Grease 8x8 inch pan. Place apples, raisins and walnuts in pan. Mix remaining ingredients thoroughly. Sprinkle over apples. Bake 30 minutes or until apples are tender and topping is golden brown.
